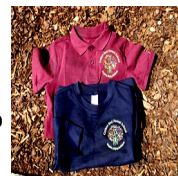
School dinners

Friday 19th October—Last day of school before half term break

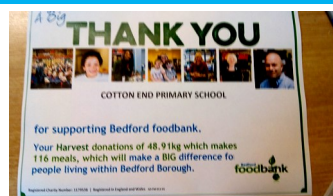
Monday 29th October—First day back to school following half term break
