Victorian Day

Ospreys class had a special Victorian experience last week when they were lucky enough to have a Victorian Day!! The day was fun and jam-packed with activities. The day began with an archaeological dig, where the children learnt about how archaeologists find out about history over the ages.

This was followed by an authentic Victorian lesson where the children wrote on slates with slate pens. The children practiced writing the alphabet and reciting their times tables to the beat of the cane on the desk!!
