Dear Parents/Carers

We have had a couple of really busy weeks in school again.

We promote active lifestyles and encourage children to walk or cycle to school and we are pleased that some children in KS2 have competently completed their bikeability sessions this week, which support road and cycle safety.

The children have shared some of their creative talents in assembly with the art club children explaining their techniques and processes used to create arctic animals using clay. We were all very impressed with their designs.

Year 3 children today shared their books they had created in DT with moving parts and explained how they had reviewed, evaluated and adapted their design along the way. Well done to all of you!

Street tag update- a very supportive parent has asked street tag to put a Poly Tag at Cotton End (the little house building on the street tag map), these are worth 300 points instead of the usual 50 points (the location is the Bell pub, but the radius covers the school front car park).
