Unlocking Letters & Sounds

In nursery we focus on the first phase of our phonics programme "Unlocking Letters and Sounds". This is a crucial phase in your child's early reading journey. There are 7 different areas.

During phase one, children will experience listening activities including listening to environmental, instrumental and body percussion sounds. We will support the children to develop their language skills by enjoying rhymes, alliteration, as well as developing rhythmic skills. We will also explore the skill of oral blending and segmenting.
